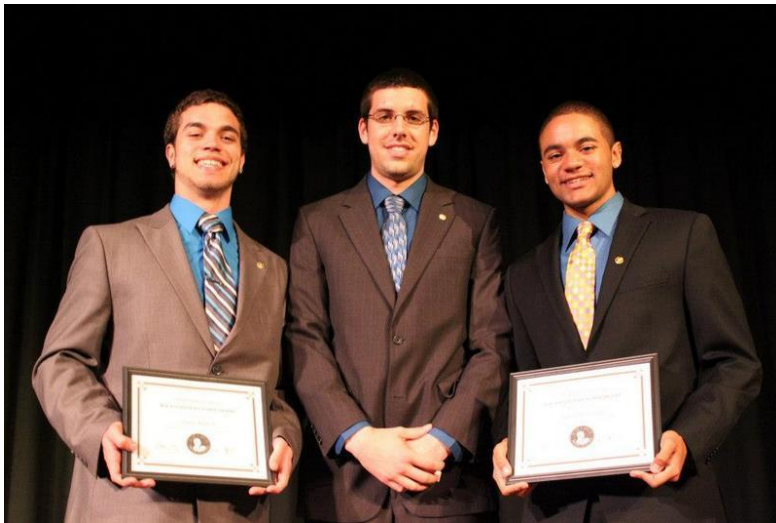

A Letter From Tyler Kitzmiller

Brothers and Friends,

As the President of Clarion SEC this semester, I had the opportunity to lead the greatest group of men that I know. The hard work and dedication put forth by all the brothers is the reason for the achievements that we have attained this semester, and I could not be more proud to call myself a SigEp! From recruitment, to member development, to winning Greek Games the hard work put forth by all brothers truly paid off.

I believe an important reason for why this chapter has attained so much is because of the guidance that was provided to us by our SEC Manager, Kyle Sutton. At the end of the fall 2012 semester I had an opportunity to sit down with our SEC Manager along with a few of the other executive board members. Together we were able to come up with a plan that outlined recruitment and the effective implementation of the Balanced Man Program. The recruitment plan was one that looked at the number of guys that we needed to recruit each semester up until Spring 2014. While this plan was focused on a short term goal it will help set a recruitment pace for semesters to come. The plan stated that we would recruit 10 guys in spring 2013, 5 guys in Fall 2013, and an additional 10 for spring 2014. Effective implementation of this plan will help us reach a chapter size of 25 guys after the class of spring 2014 graduated. Consistently recruiting at least 5 guys in the fall and 10 in the spring will help us maintain a chapter size between 25 and 30 members, a chapter size that Kyle and I agreed on would be ideal for us to exist on Clarion University's campus. As the semester comes to a close I am proud to announce that we recruited 7 new quality SigEp gentlemen during the spring 2013 semester. While this was not our goal, I have high hopes that we will exceed our goal of 5 guys in the fall to make up for the 3 guys that we did not recruit this semester.

In addition to discussing recruitment with Kyle, we discussed how to better implement the Balanced Man Program. With an increase in member disaffiliations over the past year, we decided that effective implementation of the BMP would increase member retention and decrease the number of brothers who disaffiliate. To improve the challenges, Nate, VP of Member Development, used the challenge databases on the SigEp website as a guide to redo the challenges for Sigma, Phi, and Epsilon. Nate also made sure that challenge meetings were meeting regularly and were on schedule to finish the challenges on time throughout the semester. The use of the BMP is a key reason for why we had no disaffiliations from the chapter this semester.

I was very pleased with the improvement that the chapter had in recruitment and the use of the BMP this semester, and I look forward to working with Kyle and our future SEC manager to further improve these areas of our chapter.

In addition to recruitment and member development improvement, there were also several other accomplishments that I would like to take a moment to recognize. The first of these accomplishments being that we won the 2013 Greek Games competition! The fact that we were able to place in all Greek Game competitions except for one is a true testament to all of the hard work put in by the brothers. Along with becoming Greek Game champions we also had two successful events that we sponsored this semester. The first of these events was a Cornhole Tournament that we organized as a fundraiser for the fraternity. The other event was a 5K that Cody Rapp organized and the brothers assisted with. The proceeds from the 5K were then evenly distributed amongst 5 different causes in Clarion County. Lastly, I would like to recognize the fact that we now have 3 brothers serving on the Student Senate as well as a brother who is the Student Trustee of Clarion University.

With improved recruitment, a better implemented member development program, and a brotherhood that is stronger than I've experienced since I have joined this fraternity 3 years ago, I am optimistic of this chapter's future. I look forward to building off of all the great achievements of this past semester and leading this chapter to obtaining its charter within the next year!

Before ending this letter I would like to thank our alumni and volunteers for their continued support and time that they have dedicated to help make this chapter what it is today. Enjoy the nice weather and I look forward to meeting up with a lot of you at our golf outing this summer!
